A summary of the main barriers to learning at Fen Ditton

- Access to language is a barrier for EAL pupils and other vulnerable groups including White British pupils who have limited
 reading experiences and life experiences resulting in a poor vocabulary and language acquisition
- Access to extra-curricular activities educational experiences such as trips, music, cultural and physical activities.
- Parental involvement to support pupils' learning outside of school, which can be a result of unsettled or complex home backgrounds
- Some pupils with specific social and emotional needs which affect their learning.
- Lack of confidence and self esteem
- Parents' own school experiences influencing their children's attitudes and aspirations.
- Poor attendance and punctuality.
- Barriers to progress developed over a long period of time
- Pupils early experiences often mean that they start at Fen Ditton Primary School working at much lower expected standards compared with pupils nationally different expectations and provisions at the 7 different nurseries are also a factor.
