**Fen Ditton primary School was allocated a total of £8635 during the academic year 2013 2014.  
This is broken down into £5270 between Sept 13 and March 14, then £3365 between April 14 and July 14**

**During the 2013 2014 academic year, the school has identified the following six overarching objectives to target through the use of this funding:**

**Objective 1: To improve opportunities for inter school sporting competition**

**Objective 2: To improve attendance and engagement with after school extra curricular sporting clubs**

**Objective 3: To improve opportunities for involvement in sport at lunchtimes**

**Objective 4: To improve staff confidence and skill in the delivery of high quality PE**

**Objective 5: To promote a love of cycling as a healthy lifestyle activity**

**Objective 6: To improve the quality of the facilities and resources available to pupils for PE sessions**

The following data shows the positive impact that the enhanced provision and funding or part funding club fees has made. In particular we wish to have seen the engagement rise in KS2 from 26% to 46% over the year so we will explore more options for sporting clubs in reception and KS1 next year.

Spring 14 - Appoint extra sporting coach for Fridays	£300	<b>NEXT STEPS 2014 2015:</b> 1) Develop opportunities for intra house sporting competition at lunchtime through use of the coaching staff.
Set of 10 scooters for lunchtime use	£530	Impact yet to be seen and evaluated, as scooters will be used from Sept 14. Earlier opportunities for reception and KS1 pupils to use the scooters were well received and encouraged healthy and active playtimes.

Premier Sport CPD Session – Effective Warm Ups	£80	Staff have fed back positively on the content of this session and have used the ideas in games in their own PE sessions.

Planning support from Sonia Martell – Long Term Overviews	<b>PART OF SUBSCRIPTION</b>	The long-term curriculum plans now have a clearer progression in skills and an identified focus for teaching staff on the areas of dance and gymnastics. This will allow us to plan more effectively and target CPD for staff.
Premier Sport - Team Teaching in Year 3 4 Feb 14	<b>£240</b>	Feedback from staff was positive and these sessions supported their growing confidence in delivering better quality PE lessons independently. <b>NEXT STEPS 2014 2015:</b> 1) More teaching staff to attend CPD courses aimed at the delivery of high quality dance and gymnastics lessons. This links in to the main areas of delivery for teaching staff in the new long-term curriculum plans. 2) Purchase new teaching schemes to support improved provision in Dance and Gymnastics.

<b>Objective 5: To promote a love of cycling as a healthy lifestyle activity</b>		
Autumn 14 - Balance Bike Course for Reception pupils	<b>£300</b>	27 pupils engaged with the six-week course and successfully learnt to ride balance bikes safely. Key messages about the importance of cycle safety and wearing a helmet were delivered. Significant positive impact on curriculum enjoyment.
Level 1 Bikeability Course in Year 2	<b>£250</b>	22 Year 2 pupils accessed the Level 1 Bikeability course and for several pupils this achieved the goal of learning to ride a bike independently. Pupils showed a good understanding of cycle safety and road safety awareness. Significant positive outcomes of curriculum enjoyment.
Level 2 Bikeability Course in year 6 – June 2014	<b>NO COST</b>	18/19 pupils took part in these sessions and 88% successfully achieved the skills required for Level 2 grade. Significant positive outcomes of curriculum enjoyment.
		<b>NEXT STEPS 2014 2015:</b> 1) Continue to provide these cycling opportunities 2) Promote wearing of a cycle helmet for those cycling to school. 3) Explore options to extend the cycle storage for pupils at school. 4) Establish a cycling club as an extra curricular activity.
